

#### The Poppy

After World War I, the poppy flourished in Europe. Scientists attributed the growth to soils in France and Belgium becoming enriched with lime from the rubble left by the war. From the dirt and mud grew a beautiful red poppy. The red poppy came to symbolize the blood shed during battle following the publication of the wartime poem "In Flanders Fields." The poem was written by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, M.D. while serving on the front lines. On September 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of The American Legion family to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. In 1924, the distribution of poppies became a national program of The American Legion.

Led by the American Legion Auxiliary, each year members of The American



Legion Family distribute poppies with a request that the person receiving the flower make a donation to support the future of veterans, active-duty military personnel and their families with medical and financial needs.

### April is the Month of the Military Child

In recognition and celebration of these children and their sacrifices, April was designated as Month of the Military Child by U.S. Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger in 1986. Purple Up! Day — April 15 this year — is part of the month -long celebration. To show support for military children and raise awareness

about their sacrifices, people wear purple on this special day.

Purple symbolizes a combination of the colors of each branch of the U.S. military: Army green, Navy blue, Air Force blue, Marine red, and Coast Guard blue.

#### How strong has our voice grown?

The American Legion sets the annual recruiting year from I July of each year, and runs through 30 June of the next, and the Department puts goals on us on what we should strive for. However, while we keep our eye on goals that the Department sets on us each year, I find it good to look at just how far we have come based on what we started the year off with, and just how much our voice has grown for local veterans in the local community, in our state, and in our nation.

We started off on I July 2020 with 148 current members, and throughout the year some members do leave our post for various reasons, but more seem to stay. It's each of you renewing your membership, transferring from other posts, or totally new member to The American Legion that makes us strong. I am happy to say that that, as of 29 March that voice is 180 members strong!

So what is the breakdown of the 180? We did lose 7 members for various reasons this year, and 27 members that have not renewed. The good news is
