#### **Post Membership Report**

When I first joined our post, and humbly accepted the Membership Committee Chair, I had never taken on such an endeavor. I did not expect the exponential growth we have experienced, and continue to foster. Thanks go out to each and every one of you for helping give every American Veteran a larger voice in our local community, state, and nation!

Here is a brief history of how we have grown. In July of 2018, when I began counting members, we were 87 members strong. Through strong outreach, we recruited and retained for a growth of 14 members for a total of 101 members in July of 2019. That put us at a 16 percent growth rate. I was extremely impressed! During that time, National revealed membership goals for the 2020 recruiting year. They wanted us to grow by 21, or another 20 percent. That number was daunting to say the least, but with all of you it didn't take but 7 months to make that goal, and in February we made goal! As I write this we have 127 current year (2020) members. That is 6 more above our goal, and this month we will again have the honor of voting in 2 more fellow veterans, which will bring us to a plus 28 members for 129 current year members. All this when we are only two thirds through the membership drive year! Impressive? I say yes!

However, even with all this growth we still have 17 members that have not renewed for 2020. That makes our retention rate at 84 percent, and I think we



can do better than that. We need as many as we can to join us for 2020. What can you do? The membership committee could use your help in contacting, and assist them in renewing. Having different voices reach out, and encouraging them to renew goes far. How can you do this? Call me, email me, see me at a meeting, and I will give you two or three names to reach out to over the month. I always have an up to date listing.

It's easy to renew. Simply renew at our post meetings, mail in your national renewal slip, or on-line at <u>Legion.org</u>

Can we make this a year of 50 percent growth? I think so, but it's not going to happen without you.

If you have any questions at all, just ask. We are happy to help.



### Post Welcomes Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc.

On January 22, 1942 the Flint
News Advertiser printed a coupon
asking Mothers of serviceman to
return the coupon after filling it
out. The following February 1st
300 mothers met in the Durant
Hotel, in Flint Michigan. Captain
George H. Maines, who had conceived the idea for this group, acted as the chair of this first
meeting. It was decided that after
receiving 1000 responses from the
ad to form a permanent organization.

On February 6th the organization was reported on Congressional record. Chapters then formed in Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, New York, Pennsylvania, Oregon, California, Iowa and Washington. In June of 1960 the organization was chartered by congress.

Mothers volunteered throughout the tough times of World War II. They worked in hospitals, train stations, packed care packages for soldiers and were a working part of homeland security during times of war. The organization waned in size over the years but has held together by mothers showing pride in both their children and country. In recent times we have begun to grow in strength. Being



attacked on our own soil has once again started mothers hanging flags in their windows at home proclaiming pride in the fact that we have children protecting our freedom during at time of war.

We now have a local Chapter of the Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. meeting here in our Post Home. Cereal City MOMMAS (Mothers of Military Members Appreciating Service) were chartered in 2014. They hold their monthly meetings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday at 6pm. Membership is open to Mothers who have children in the service (active, retired, guard, reserves, etc), or anyone who believes in the Mission. They also have associate members know as Blue Star Dads. Three of our own Post members carry that title.
